



## 2022 Conservation Highlights

Each year, the Conservation District Board of Supervisors reviews and adopts an annual work plan to direct district operations and services. This plan is based on a long-range plan that is also developed and adopted by the board. For 2022 the focus of our annual work plan was on water, fish and wildlife habitat, and soil, with the following specific objectives:

- Reduce Water Use
- Improve and Protect Water Quality
- Enhance and Restore Fish and Wildlife Habitat
- Conserve Farmland and Forestland
- Education and outreach

Here's a brief snapshot of how we tackled these objectives in 2022 to put conservation on the ground.

- ✓ Installed 1,300 feet of irrigation pipeline to conserve water in the Dungeness River.
- ✓ Provided technical assistance to 58 farms to help improve water quality.
- ✓ Planted 1.45 miles of riparian buffers along rivers and streams.
- ✓ Coordinated with multiple agencies to promote farm and forestland management and conservation.
- ✓ Held 26 educational events with over 1,100 people in attendance on topics including natural landscaping, land management for farms, and riparian habitat.
- ✓ Coordinated 21 volunteer events attended by 279 people.

Highlights: Planting 9,235 native trees and shrubs for riparian and pollinator habitat and removing 1,050 pounds of debris from streams.
